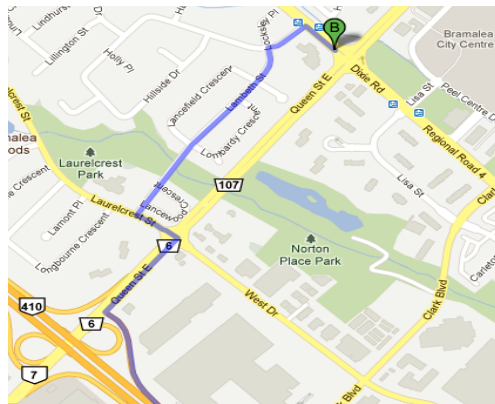

DIRECTIONS:

From 401: Take exit **344** to merge onto **ON-410 N** toward **Brampton**. Then take the **Regional Road 107/Queen Street** exit. Turn right onto **Queen St E/Regional Road 107/Regional Road 6 E** (signs for **Queen Street E**). Then take the 1st left onto **Laurelcrest St**. Then turn right onto **Lambeth St**. Turn right onto **Hillside Dr**. Church parking lot will be on the right hand side.

From 403: Keep left at the fork, follow signs for **ON-410/Brampton** and merge onto **ON-410 N**. Then take the **Queen Street** exit **E**. Then take the 1st left onto **Laurelcrest St**. Then turn right onto **Lambeth St**. Turn right onto **Hillside Dr**. Church parking lot will be on the right hand side.
